


Car models come in various sizes, and I prefer the smaller, more detailed ones.

2023 ODPCC POSTCARD & PAPER SHOW EXHIBITION BOARD COMPETITION

This year's Show featured a whopping 46 exhibition boards entered by 19 Club members! Phil Anderson's "Mannekin-Pis" took BEST IN SHOW, while Tre Rockenbach's "Life in a Belgian Town" received the Judges' MOST INTERESTING Award. And in what may be a first, we had ties for both the Tim O'Gorman People's Choice Award (Betsy Wadington's "Here's Looking at You, Kid"



and Warren Long's "Krampus") and the Ben Duncan Award of Excellence (Betsy Wadington's "Here's Looking at You, Kid" and John Selph's "Really Rare Richmond" – or as one member

Wished You Owned, But Don't.") The Ben Duncan Award includes a \$100 prize, which will be split equally between Betsy and John.

John Whiting issued a Ben Duncan Four-Board Challenge, accompanied by a \$100 award from the Club, to be shared by any members who entered four or more boards. There were five members who will receive \$20 each: Phil Anderson (7 boards!), John Selph (5 boards!), and Henry Fogle, Tre Rockenbach and Mike Uzel (4 boards each).

Participants did such an amazing job that the results were very close and the judges had some very difficult decisions to make. 







